

7. Trust those who are ministering BEYOND the counselling given, even more than THEIR OWN ideas, to the point of discarding deceptive notions when required (Prov. 3:5, John 10:4,5,14).

This sounds dangerous, but quite obviously sufferers are only going to put their souls in the hands of a Christian deliverance minister of whom they have heard at least some good reports. When they arrive at the meetings they will be tuned in spiritually for evidence of the presence of the risen Christ in the meeting and in the ministers. They don't have to stay, but if they do, wanting your help in Christ, then it is very often necessary for them to put down their preconceived ideas (usually polluted) and trust that the Holy Spirit will guide you on their behalf (See Book I, Chap. 4).

People who come to you because they are desperate and have nothing to lose except their problems will probably trust you immediately and make speedy progress. Others less desperate may find it difficult to trust you, and barriers will need to be overcome before they can really advance into full Restoration.

8. *Keep looking ahead* to the ultimate victory, and not looking back until it is achieved, i.e., the personal *determination TO WIN* in the Name of the Lord Jesus (Luke 9:62, Gal. 6:9, Phil. 3:12-4:1, Rev. 2:1-3:22).
9. *REJOICE in the SOLUTION* provided by Jesus Christ our Lord, that is, the provision of a FULL SALVATION within the vision of the End Time and the RESTORATION of the whole true Church; and rejoice in belonging! (Phil. 4:4-7, I Thes. 5:16-18, I Peter 1:5-9, James 1:2-4).
10. *Keep the Word of God* in the New Covenant and *walk in the Spirit*, more and more, moment to moment (John 3:36, Gal. 5:16-25, Eph. 5:15-20, Phil. 1:27-2:2).
